Phippsburg protected lands and hiking trails

This Phippsburg Land Trust publication shows the locations of protected lands in Phippsburg and the approximately 31 miles of hiking trails located on these lands.

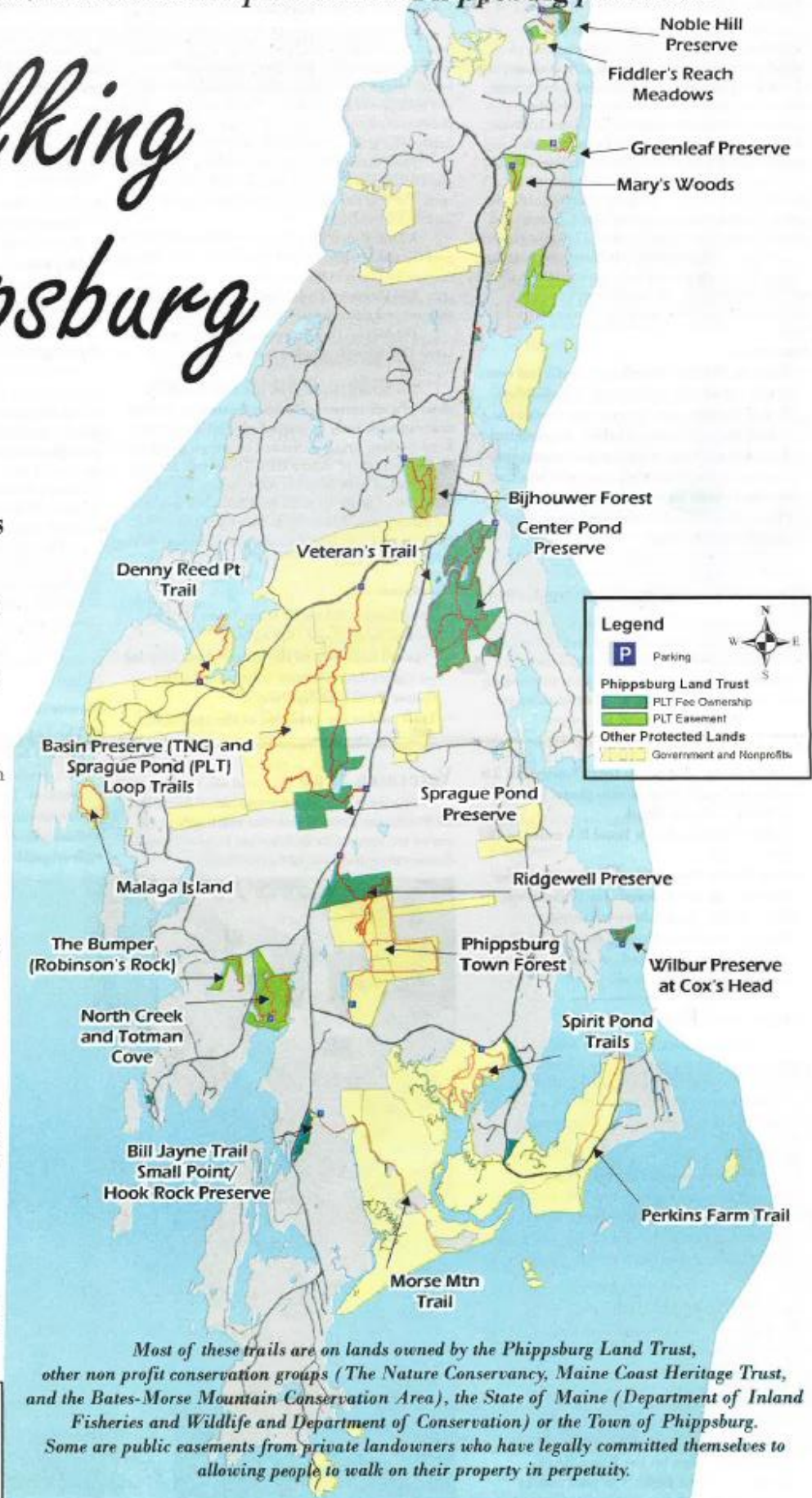
More detailed maps of the more complex trail networks can usually be found in map boxes located at the parking areas of the Center Pond, Sprague Pond, Ridgewell and Spirit Pond Preserves.

Not shown are the numerous abandoned roads, beaches, and walking paths on private lands, which add many miles to the hiking opportunities of our small peninsula community.

Twenty two miles of these trails were constructed by and are maintained by the Phippsburg Land Trust. This is a major and expensive effort for a small, volunteer group with no fulltime employees.

Most of these trails are on lands owned by the Phippsburg Land Trust, other non profit conservation groups (The Nature Conservancy, Maine Coast Heritage Trust, and the Bates-Morse Mountain Conservation Area), the State of Maine (Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and Department of Conservation) or the Town of Phippsburg. Some are public easements from private landowners who have legally committed themselves to allowing people to walk on their property in perpetuity.
